#### Volunteering at School:

We continue to receive questions regarding volunteering at school or on school trips. Parents/guardians at school must have a copy of a completed criminal records check **WITH** vulnerable sector and a child abuse registry These are TWO separate data bases so both have to be conducted and clear. The school can send an email link to you for both of these checks, which reduces the cost of the criminal records check/with



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vulnerable sector to \$30 (down from \$50). A child abuse registry is free. Checks are good for 3 years.
