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dismissal time to drop off/pick up students (8:05-9:00; 2:30-3:15). This is in the interest of keeping all students safe. Students arriving late should come to the office to get checked in by office staff, so we can accurately report attendance. All visitors to the building need to enter through the front door and check with office staff before proceeding to other areas of the school, including classrooms. We thank you for your cooperation.

Inclement Weather Plan:

Winter is close at hand and along with it come concerns of ice/snowstorms and possible early dismissals. On rare occasions, schools may also be cancelled because of some type of mechanical/electrical failure. When this happens, we need to be sure that someone is home or that the students have a plan in place if a parent/guardian is not at home. In the event of a mid-day closure, the school will reach out to the names designated as contacts for your child to inform them of the early closure. No student will be released without a parent, emergency contact or designate being contacted by phone. In case of early morning inclement weather, HRCE will decide whether or not to cancel school and will announce on the local radio stations, the HRCE website (www.hrce.ca) and through the school cancellation number (464-4636) usually by 6:00 a.m. As well, you can be notified by email and/or text. Click the notification button on the HRCE website to register (www.hrce.ca) We belong to the J.L. Ilsley Family of Schools. If school is cancelled for the J.L family, then JWMFT is closed. If busses are not running but schools are open in the J.L. family, then we are open for walkers and students being driven to school. There is also a possibility that we could have a delayed opening on inclement weather days – with schools starting 2 hours later than normal start time. If this occurs, it will be clearly communicated as well.

Occasionally, the school may be cancelled during the school day. In such cases, the HRCE will inform the schools by 11:00 a.m. Radio stations will also announce school closures. If you see that weather conditions are becoming more severe, then please listen to your radio for a possible announcement of a mid-day closure.

Changes to Dismissal Plan:

As we are sure you can appreciate, the office receives frequent calls to deliver messages to students about changes to afternoon dismissal plans. Due to the busy nature of the office, we cannot guarantee that messages will get delivered by dismissal time, especially if they are left on voicemail later in the day. We



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understand that there are times when emergencies arise and a phone call is necessary, however, we like to ask that, when possible, arrangements for after school plans be communicated via the classroom teacher in the form of a note. The teacher can then highlight the message as part of the dismissal plan to ensure students arrive safely to their destination. As a reminder, students are only permitted to ride on the school bus if they are registered to be on that bus. If you child is not yet registered, we would be happy to help you with that process. Bus drivers will be doing manifest checks during the month of November.

New Hot Lunch Program Starting in December:

We will be implementing a new hot lunch program in December called Healthy Hunger. This will give the option to parents/guardians to order on a weekly and/or monthly basis. Pizza, subs and pasta will still be available on the same days, but subs will now be sold through Subway vs. Uncle Buck's.

Remembrance Day, Assessment and Evaluation Day and Parent/Teacher:

There is no school for students on three days this month: Monday, November 13th (Holiday), Friday, November 17th (Assessment & Eval) and Thursday, November 23rd (Parent/Teacher).

Report Cards:

Report cards will be distributed to families via email between November 21st-28th.

Parent Teacher Interviews and PD:

Parent Teacher interviews will be taking place on Thursday, November 23rd. There is no school for students in the am due to PD taking place. Interviews will start in the afternoon from 1:00-3:30 pm and resume in the evening from 5:00-7:30 pm. You will be contacted by your child's teacher to confirm an appointment time.

PD Day:

A professional development day is scheduled for staff on Monday, December 4th. There is no school for students on this day.

Parent/guardians should have received and returned picture proofs. Picture retake day is happening on Wednesday, November 22nd.
