### Have you heard?

Report cards were distributed to families on Tuesday, April 2<sup>nd</sup>. Please contact the office if you are having trouble accessing the report card.

Out of area requests opened on April 2<sup>nd</sup> for the 2023-2024 school year. Please note, a decision on out of area requests likely won't be made until the end of August, after late registration has occurred. Approval will only be granted if room exists in the requested classroom (defined by class caps). Approval is considered, in order, by date/time of submission. Students who have siblings already attending JWMFT do receive preference. There is no pre-primary French option. Students must register at their home school for pre-primary and apply for out of area consideration. Students who are switching programs (i.e. French to English), must return to their home English school (if not in JWMFT's catchment) and apply for out of area consideration as well (if no room exists).

Our Run Club has started and as expected, we have a great number of participants. Thank you to the volunteers and staff who are assisting with this great opportunity.

In late May, we will be registering for the BLUE NOSE YOUTH RUN where students complete the last 4 kms, to have a total of 42 kms (the length of a marathon).

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#### Parent Teacher Interviews:

#### Water Bottles and Cutlery:

We continue to remind students to bring water bottles and cutlery to school. If you could assist us in reminding students to keep these items in their bag, we would greatly appreciate it. Thanking you in advance.



#### April Mindfulness Tip:

You know the feeling when you suddenly realize your neck, shoulders, or back is full of tension... right? Try the Mindful Body Scan technique. While sitting or lying down, try to stop and check-in with how you are physically feeling, without judging yourself or asking "why". Check-in questions include:

"How is my breath? Shallow or deep?" "Where do I feel sore or tense?" "How does my (back/shoulders/face muscles/feet/neck) feel?"

As you go through these cues, try responding by relaxing that part of your body. A body scan is a simple and essential mindfulness skill that can help you connect with the present moment, reduce anxiety and stress, and feel calmer. 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#### Earth Day:

Earth Day is an annual event on April 22 to demonstrate support for environmental protection. First held on April 22, 1970, it now includes a wide range of events coordinated globally by Earthday.org including 1 billion people in more than 193 countries. The official theme for 2024 is "Planet vs. Plastics.

#### Parking Lot and Traffic Safety:

In recent weeks, we have observed a concerning trend of vehicles parking in the designated "NO Stopping/Parking" zone at the back of the school path crosswalk area. Not following the traffic regulations poses a significant risk to the safety of our children, particularly during drop-off and pick-up times when pedestrian traffic is at its peak. We emphasize the importance of adhering to these parking restrictions for the safety of all members of our school community. Parking in prohibited areas obstructs visibility for both drivers and pedestrians, increasing the likelihood of accidents and endangering the safety of our students.

While we totally understand the challenges associated with finding parking during busy times, there are alternative parking spots available nearby. We kindly ask for your cooperation in utilizing them instead of parking in restricted areas. This includes not entering the school parking lot during arrival and dismissal times. Students are loading/unloading from busses, walking to school from different entry points on the property and sometimes are not completely visible. We have staff that monitor morning and afternoon procedures who are still stopping cars during both peak times. If you have a relative dropping off or picking up your child, we ask that you please inform them of the protocols. Again, we understand that parking is extremely limited, but the safety of our students must come first.

We would like to express our sincere appreciation to those who have consistently followed parking guidelines and contributed to a safer school environment. Your cooperation sets a positive example for our community, and we encourage others to follow suit.
